

Regulations & Scheme

1. Credits – For each subject as distributed by the respective Boards of Studies (Given in the Syllabus)

2. Internal Assessment - 20 Marks for each subject. Each student should submit two assignments and each assignment carries 10 marks. There is no minimum passing mark for assignment.

However, for UG courses a student should score a minimum of 32 marks in external examination (i.e., 40% of the external 80 marks) with an aggregate of 40 marks in each subject.

For PG courses a student should score a minimum of 40 marks in external examination (i.e., 50% of the external 80 marks) with an aggregate of 50 marks in each subject.

3. Question Paper Pattern & Distribution of Marks - PART A consists of 8 questions and of which 5 questions are to be answered. Each question carries 4 marks.

$$5 \times 4 = 20 \text{ marks}$$

PART B consists of 8 questions and of which 5 questions are to be answered. Each question carries 12 marks.
$$5 \times 12 = 60 \text{ marks}$$

$$\text{Total} = 80 \text{ marks}$$

4. Maximum period for Qualifying degree to which Students are admitted - N + 2 years i.e., for UG Courses 5 Years (3+2)
For 3 Years PG courses 5 Years (3+2)
For 2 Years PG courses 4 Years (2+2)
For 1 Year Diploma course 3 Years (1+2) from the admission cycle in which admissions are made
