About the University

The Manonmaniam Sundaranar University was established by Government of Tamil Nadu by its Act No.31 of 1990. This University has been granted 12B and 2(f) recognition by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi Vide its Communication No F.No. 5-1/90 (CPP-I) dt 29.03.1994. The University, which was named after the famous Tamil Scholar Professor P. Sundaram Pillai, established on 7 September, 1990 to cater to the long felt needs of the people of the three southern most districts of Tamil Nadu namely Tirunelveli, Tenkasi, Tuticorin and Kanyakumari. The University has under its jurisdiction 61 affiliated colleges, 5 Mano Colleges and 1 Constituent College, with 65,000 students on rolls. There are 25 academic departments in the University. All the University departments are receiving research projects from several funding agencies in India, Europe, USA, Japan and UNO. The courses offered by the university have been designed keeping in mind the changing times and the emerging needs of the region. Manonmaniam Sundaranar University is the first to offer choice-based credit system in Tamil Nadu.

Background of the training

Disasters threaten the lives, constitutional rights and needs of the children worldwide. In past two decades India have faced devastating disasters such as Latur Earthquake (1993), Odisha Super Cyclone (1999), Bhuj Earthquake (2001), Indian Tsunami (2004), Jammu & Kashmir Earthquake (2005), Bihar Floods (2008), Uttarakhand Floods (2013), Cyclone Phailin (2013), Chennai Flood (2015), Kerala Flood (2018), and Cyclone Fani (2019). Droughts are slow onset disasters, adversely affecting children and women alike. Karnataka (16 districts) and Andhra Pradesh (4 districts) experienced at least 10 droughts between 2001-2015. During these emergencies children are especially vulnerable to diseases, malnutrition, violence and trafficking. Measles, diarrhoea, acute respiratory infections, malaria and malnutrition are the major killers of children during humanitarian crises. In future,

vulnerability of children is expected to increase as the intensity and frequency of natural disasters rises.

Keeping in view the increasing vulnerability of children from climate change and natural disasters, National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM), Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India has established “**Engaging Youth and Adolescents in Disaster Risk Management & Climate Change Adaptation**”(EYADRM) to mainstream child centric DRR activities through Training, Research, Advocacy and Consultancy.

Aim of Training

This 5-day **Training of Trainers Programme on “Engaging Youth and Adolescents in Disaster Risk Management & Climate Change Adaptation”** is intended for Programme officers and Co-ordinators of the National Service Scheme (NSS) Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS), Civil Defence Volunteers (CDV), Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS), Bharat Scouts and Guides (BSGs) and National Cadet Corps (NCC), Administrative Training Institutions and civil society trainers to help build their knowledge, skills and perspectives towards child centric disaster risk reduction. This will help officials understand and prepare for risk informed planning, sectoral readiness and preparedness for emergencies so as children are not deprived of basic amenities.

Objectives

At the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Explain the basic concepts of Disaster Risk Management
- Define youth, adolescents and Volunteerism
- Describe the process of engaging Youth Volunteers in disaster Risk management
- Explain the Role of youth& adolescents in mitigating impact of climate change
- Can identify list of Disaster risk management activities to be implement by youth& adolescents.
- Describe the role of youth organisation in Disaster Risk Management
- Prepare action plan for Youth organisation to involve in Disaster Risk Management
